The group's goal was to look at the past and present of the church, and to formulate recommendations for one, five, ten and fifteen years from now. Week after week the committee met, studied, discussed and pondered, and kept returning to a familiar refrain: This is a strong church that's doing good things for God in the world! We'd like to keep that momentum going as we look to the future. How blessed we are!

In February, Kyle Louder led Session in a presentation and discussion of the Committee's findings and recommendations. Session recommended a few clarifying changes on the group's recommendations, then voted unanimously to accept the proposals and begin putting recommendations into place, including adoption of the church's new mission statement: "A community that serves God and others through worship, love, and faith."

On the evening of March 24, 2024, the findings of the committee and proposals were presented to the congregation. Packets containing the individual reports, findings, and recommendations were distributed at that meeting. They researched church history, talked to many in church leadership and within the congregation, and did work in the community in order to come to their conclusions. They are appreciated greatly. 

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Mexico, Missouri met on Monday, February 18, 2024. Elders shared joys and concerns and the moderator opened the meeting with prayer.

The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including prior minutes, financial reports, and the meeting agenda.

**Adult Fellowship:** Whitney reported that the committee is working on scheduling a trip to Amish Country.

**Adult Education:** Mike Briggs shared some pamphlets with Session that he would like to make available to our church members.

**Children's Ministry:** Whitney reported that Summer Sunday School will again combine pre-K through 5th grade classes. Bible Buddy presentations will occur on April 28. Whitney and Charleigh Lewis will give a Minute for Mission about youth camp during an April worship service.

**Fellowship:** Sheryl reported attendance during Lenten lunches ranged from 22 to 32. Fellowship time on Easter will be after the egg hunt. The committee is also working on updating their mission statement.

**Local Mission:** Elaine reported on things learned by the committee members that attended the Bright Futures Council meeting.

**Music and Worship:** Combined bell choir will play on March 17. The committee voted to donate \$50 to Our Daily Bread for the devotional booklets we receive from them.

**National and Global Mission:** Steve Haag is working with former committee chairs to arrange visits from missionaries we support. He is also looking at traditional mission projects as well as new ideas.

**Pastoral Care:** At the advice of the chair of this committee, Session voted to dissolve the committee as it is redundant with the work done by Deacons and other committees.

**Presbyterian Women:** Lori Ray will be the PW representative on the Nominating Committee this year.

Stewardship & Finance: Robby reported that the committee will be adding two new members.

**Stephen Ministers:** Mike is asking for referrals. The committee would like some younger people to be Stephen Leaders.

**Technology:** Jay Chastain continues to help with tech issues in multiple ways, for which we are grateful.

Youth and Young Adult: Micah reported that there is a retreat next week. Also, Senior Sunday is scheduled for May 5.

**New Business:** Session voted to approve the baptism of Jan Harlow.

Clerk's Report: Dianne reported that Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was served in worship and at the Kings Daughters Home and at Pin Oaks in March by Pastor Susan. The Clerk also shared a ministry engagement and support letter from General Assembly, and gave a required annual report on the insurance held by the church.
