#### Around the Table, Around the World

On the first Sunday of October, Christians from all different denominations gather to celebrate World Communion Sunday. It's one of the rare days when believers everywhere—whether they worship in a soaring cathedral, a storefront church, or under the shade of a tree—are invited to remember that Christ's table stretches far beyond our own sanctuary walls.

When we say "the church around the world," it's easy to picture a few distant congregations. But the worldwide body of Christ is huge and beautifully varied. The best estimates say there are over 2.3 billion Christians on every continent. The largest numbers live in the Global South—in places like Brazil, Mexico, Nigeria, and the Philippines—where Christianity has grown rapidly over the last century. Africa alone is now home to more Christians than Europe. Meanwhile, vibrant communities continue to flourish in Asia, from rural house churches in China to thriving Christian groups in India and South Korea.

Even within the United States, our own congregation is only a tiny brushstroke in a vast mural that is US Christianity. Our worship style and favorite hymns may be different than some, but the heart of our faith—the grace of Jesus Christ—unites us with sisters and brothers we may never meet.

World Communion Sunday invites us to imagine the diversity of that great banquet. On that morning, as we share bread and cup, others will break cassava or rice cakes, lift prayers in Swahili or Spanish, sing ancient chants or new praise songs. We are different in countless ways, yet bound together by the same Spirit.

So when you come to the Lord's Table this October 5, let's pause for a moment. Picture the believers in Lagos and Lima, Seoul and Santiago, Cape Town and Cairo. Give thanks for the worldwide family God has called together. And remember: in Christ, we are never just a small congregation on the corner of Clark and Lakeview; we are part of a kingdom without borders.

#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FROM SEPTEMBER 15, 2025**

The session met on Monday, September 15, 2025. Pastor Susan opened the meeting with prayer. Joys and concerns were shared. The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including prior minutes, financial reports, and the current meeting agenda.

Adult Fellowship: Hickory Ridge Sunday Funday will be October 5th. Discount coupons will be available.

**Children's Committee:** Fall Sunday School will start on August 31, and classes will be returning to Growing in Grace and Gratitude curriculum.

Local Mission: The committee is involved in the "Getting Ahead Program".

**Outreach:** The committee had a phenomenal turnout at Soybean Festival. They continues to welcome visitors and return visitors.

**Presbyterian Women:** Elaine reported that the Circles have started their meetings for the year.

**Stewardship:** Robby reported that our church is financially stable. We're about 3% under on income per budget, but also 3% under on expenses. The committee is working on this year's Stewardship campaign. The committee also made a motion to move \$24,012.87 from the Bequest Fund to the Property Fund bringing the Property Fund balance to \$0. The motion passed unanimously. The committee is also working to clean up the designated fund categories to make them more transparent.

**Technology:** Micah reported that he and the Property Committee are installing a replacement rear-facing projector in the sanctuary, and he has been addressing microphone issues as well.

Youth & Young Adult Ministry: Micah and Andrew reported that a Halloween event is being planned.

**Pastor's Report:** Susan reported that she will be out of town for continuing education on October 12, and Michael Moore will be preaching. On October 19, Rev. Matt Brown and Susan will lead worship together with Rev. Brown preaching.

**Student Ministries Director Report:** Micah reported that he has finished his Worship and Sacraments class and has started his Hebrew class.

**Old Business:** Ron reported on the August Presbytery meeting in Columbia. A representative from the Board of Pensions discussed insurance, and the Evelyn Bedell awards were given.

**New Business:** The Sexual Misconduct Policy was reviewed and approved.

Clerk's Report: Communion was served on September 7 during the service and at King's Daughters.

The meeting closed with a devotion by Steve Haag on Ephesians 2:4-5, and with prayer.

The next Session meeting will be Monday, October 20, 2025.



The sign-up sheet for arrangements or memorials is on the wall near the church office.













October Blessing Box suggestions are: soup & crackers.


