Happy New Year!

Traditionally (and practically), New Year's is an opportunity for each of us to take stock of our lives, think about the future, and make some changes. Some of us make resolutions. We plan and hope to accomplish something in the next 12 months. Others of us set goals, which gives us a target to shoot for, but might feel a little less onerous than a resolution. Either way, this practice usually has us focusing on the last year and making a plan for what should change.

New year's resolutions aren't a new thing. The ancient Babylonians had a practice of starting each year with a pledge to return items they'd borrowed. The ancient Romans started their years by promising one of their gods that they would just do better overall in the coming year.

While making a goal or resolution isn't a bad idea by any means, two problems can occur:

Statistically, people aren't very good at keeping resolutions. Studies vary, but all the statistics and surveys I found showed that over 50% of people who rely on their own willpower don't make their annual goal.

Resolutions don't account for the unexpected parts of life that inevitably happen. The Apostle Paul, for example, surely didn't start a year off with the goal of landing in prison for his faith – yet that's what happened. In spite of that, he managed to use the experience to glorify God.

That's the beauty of the new year. As 2023 draws to a close and 2024 begins, whether you make resolutions or goals or just hope for a good year overall, let's keep these things in mind: First, if we rely on the Lord, our results are much more likely to be successful than if we rely on ourselves. And second, when the unexpected happens (and it surely will), God will be there with us. As the Apostle Paul told us, "The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." God is our fortress and our strength. He always

has been and will continue to be all through 2024. Let's focus on God's power, beauty, and glory.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FROM DECEMBER, 2023

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Mexico, Missouri met for a stated meeting on December 18, 2023. Pastor Susan opened the meeting in prayer.

The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including minutes from the November stated meeting, the November congregational meeting, and the November financial reports, and the agenda for the December meeting. Highlights of the meeting included:

New Members! Session met with Scott and Becky Fischer, and joyfully voted to accept them as new members.

<u>Adult Education:</u> Mike Briggs reported that the Saturday Men's Group will begin a new study of the Gospel of John in January. Bob Fenlon's Sunday School class will be starting a new study using a book by C.S. Lewis.

<u>Children's Ministry:</u> Stephanie Robinett reported that the Pen Pal Program will kick off with a Pen Pal Party on January 7th. <u>National and Global Mission:</u> Bob Fenlon reported that the committee is working to bring in presentations from Mobility Worldwide and Presbyterian Childrens Home and Services early in 2024. Elaine is going to let us know when the Whites' (missionaries that we support) have their next conference on Zoom.

Staff: Dianne Maguire reported that Staff annual evaluations are underway.

<u>Stewardship and Finance</u>: Andy Baker explained the proposed budget for next year, and brought a motion from Committee to the session. The motion passed unanimously.

<u>Trustees</u>: Ron Ray mentioned that in January there will be endowment monies that the session will be tasked with deciding what to do with. These funds are not included in the budget.

<u>Visioning Task Force:</u> This committee has two more meetings and will then present their findings and recommendations to Session early next year.

New Business: Motion was made and approved for the installation and ordination of officers, the congregational meeting and the corporation annual meeting to occur on January 7, 2024 immediately following the worship service. The special Christmas Eve offering was approved, with funds being split between ACCIS and the Help Center. Session approved a request from Jaye Jackson and the MLK Jr. Committee to have a service here the afternoon of January 14. The Blue Christmas service, co-hosted with First Christian Church, was approved for January 18. Session approved a request from *Friends and Family Veterans'* Support Organization to meet in the building on a monthly basis. A motion was made and approved to add the responsibilities of *Nursery Supervisor* under the Student Ministries Director's Job Description. The baptism of Brixten Louder was approved for January 14, 2024.

<u>Clerk's Report:</u> Communion was served on December 3, 2023 in the worship service and at King's Daughters Home. The clerk passed around a *Ministry Engagement and Support Letter* from the Presbytery for all the elders to see.

The outgoing elders (Rob Dalton, Bob Fenlon, Joanne Nelson, and Judy Dye) were thanked for their gracious years of service.

The meeting closed with a devotion and prayer from Stephanie Robinett and the meeting was adjourned.
