Lent and Easter 2024

The season of Lent is upon us! We began on Ash Wednesday, with our combined service with First Christian Church and Mexico United Methodist church. However, not all of us grew up with the tradition of observing the Lenten season, and I'm often asked, "When did Protestants start doing Lent?"

The answer is "a couple of decades ago." The observance of Lent has caught on gradually with Protestants as we realized its value. On Ash Wednesday, when the minister puts ashes onto our foreheads, the ashes are symbolic of repentance, mourning, and a memory of our mortality. (If you were at the ecumenical Lenten service, you heard Pastor Zane Whorton quote Genesis, saying "From dust you came, and from dust you shall return.")

As Christians, we certainly celebrate Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday. Unfortunately, we often forget that it was our sin that caused Christ to be crucified. This is where Lent comes in. It's a time of prayer, repentance and recommitment during the days leading up to Easter. I think of it as sort of a "spring cleaning" season. It's a time to clean out the clutter in my life that doesn't really match what I believe about God, and who God wants me to be.

Traditionally, people have given up something for the 40 days of Lent: A certain food, a habit they need to shake off, or an extravagance in their lives. People have also started using Lent as a time to add in a new tradition that may have been lacking in their lives: a time for daily prayer or Bible reading, a new commitment to helping others, or a decision to participate more actively in worship services.

Here at First Presbyterian, we have Lenten lunches on Mondays and evening services on Wednesday, during which you can draw closer to God during this season.

Lent is rich in symbolism, and a great way to prepare us for the celebration that is Easter. Whether you add something to your life, fast from something, or do something completely different, we all look forward to Easter! Blessings on you this season!

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FROM FEBRUARY 19, 2024

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Mexico, Missouri met on Monday, February 19, 2024. Elders shared joys and concerns and the moderator opened the meeting with prayer.

Stephanie Robinett was elected clerk of session for this month's meeting.

The consent agenda was accepted into the record, including prior minutes, financial reports, and the meeting agenda. Adult Fellowship: Abby Ray is the new chair of this committee.

<u>Adult Education:</u> Mike Briggs reported on updates to the church library and current and upcoming classes. Pastor Susan will be leading a class in the Summer.

<u>Children's Ministry</u>: Whitney Lewis gave updates and reported that the committee will let Stewardship know if scholarships are needed for campers in the Summer.

Columbarium: Paperwork is being processed for two people who requested cancelation of their niche.

<u>Deacons</u>: The new co-chairs of Deacons are Liz Schutte and Liz Rice. Deacons will meet quarterly rather than monthly. Fellowship: Sheryl Louder reported on Lenten Lunches and progress with funeral dinner organization.

<u>Local Mission</u>: Elaine Mensching reported that Baby Bundle Sunday will be on Mother's Day, May 12. The committee will be inviting representatives from local organizations that we support to speak during Moments for Mission on Sundays. Two members of the committee attended a Bright Futures Council meeting.

Music and Worship: Combined bell choir will play on March 17. The committee voted to donate \$50 to Our Daily Bread for the devotional booklets we receive from them.

<u>National and Global Mission:</u> Steve Haag is working with former committee chairs to arrange visits from missionaries we support. He is also looking at traditional mission projects as well as new ideas.

Outreach: The committee voted to cease weekly ads in the Leger, reserving newspaper advertising for special events.

<u>Presbyterian Women</u>: Elaine Mensching said PW is working on lists to honor 50 year members as well as choosing a Lifetime Member Award recipient.

<u>Staff & Administration:</u> A motion was made and unanimously approved to approve the hiring of Piper Higgins and Margaret Crews as nursery workers, contingent on the Staff Committee's approval.

<u>Stewardship & Finance:</u> Robby Miller reported that the church is on par with income and expenses, and also explained the offering counting procedure to Session.

Stephen Ministers: The group has a new care receiver. Next meeting is March 5.

<u>Clerk's Report</u>: The Clerk reported the baptism of Brixten Louder on January 29, the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was served in worship and at the Kings Daughters Home and Pin Oaks on January 7, 2024 by Pastor Susan. Session approved a request by Dave and Renae Thomas from the rolls. The Clerk reported on the death of Renae Thomas.

The meeting closed with a devotion and prayer from Elaine Mensching and the meeting was adjourned.

- 3) Committee chairs may send their agenda to the office so it can be printed before the meeting with the last meetings minutes.
- 4) Sticking to the agenda during the meeting will make the meeting more enjoyable and productive for everyone.
- 5) Some people enjoy the social aspect of meetings, while others have extensive commitments and appreciate shorter meetings. Both needs can be met if time is set aside after the meeting adjourns for people who want to visit.
- 6) Learning the basics of Robert's Rules of Order is an asset to anyone attending a meeting here or at other organizations.
